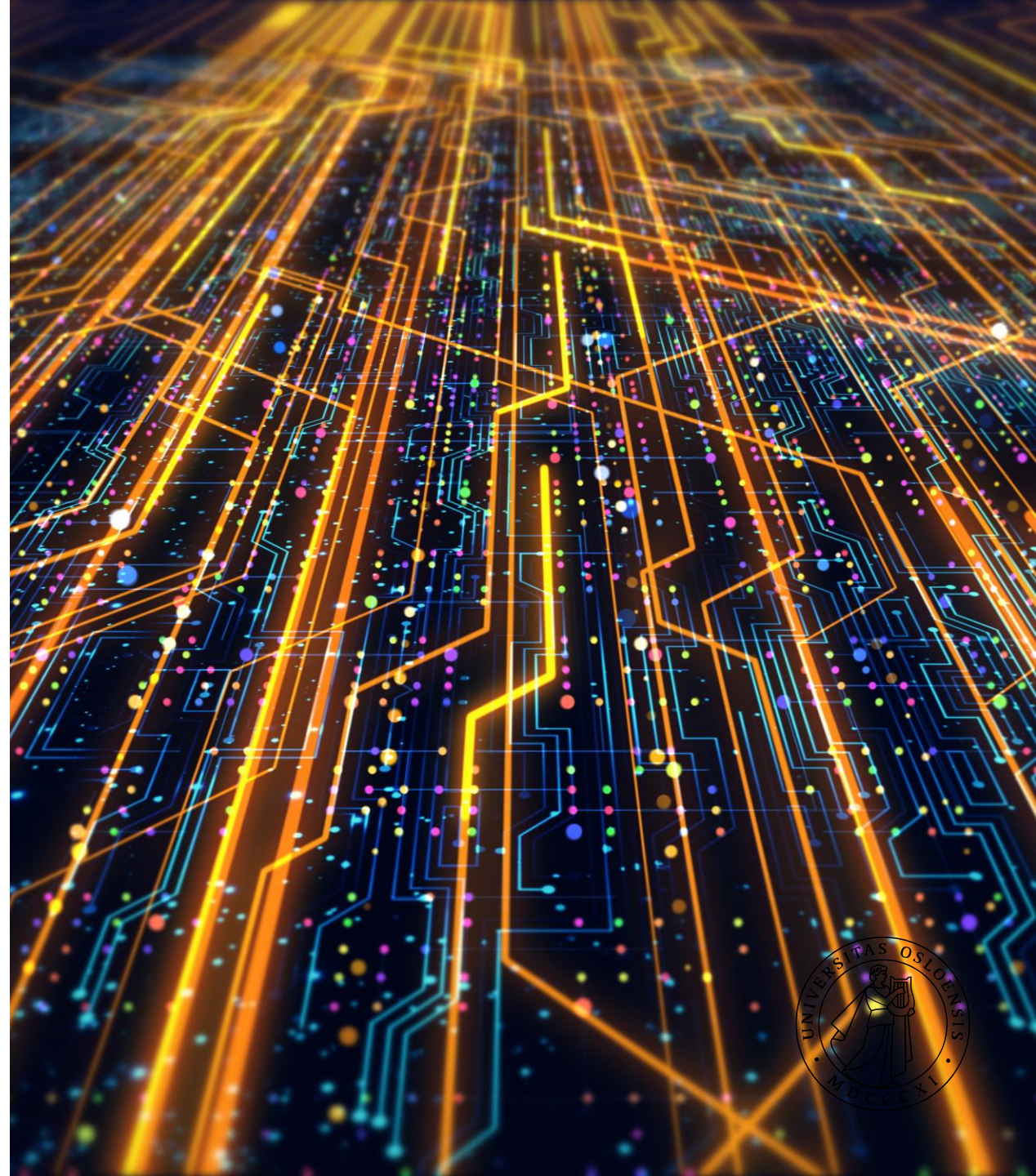

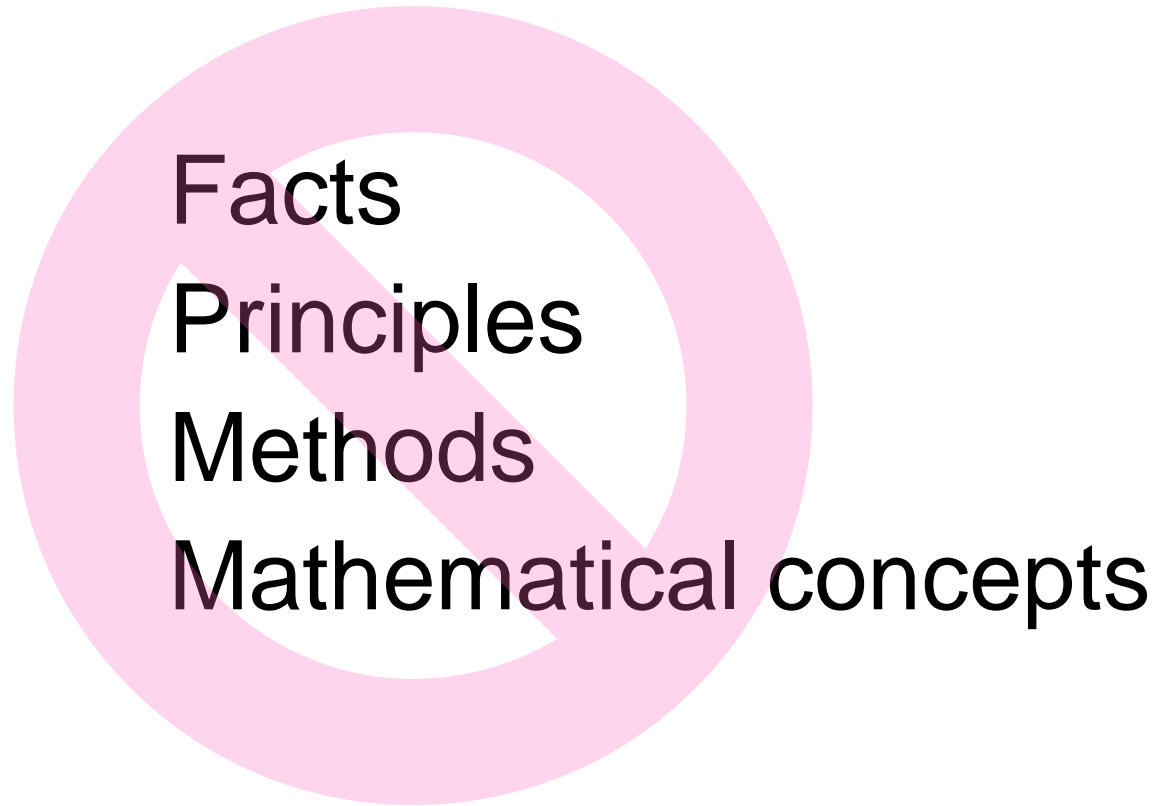

Works covered by copyright range from books, music, paintings, sculpture, and films, to computer programs, databases, advertisements, maps, and technical drawings.

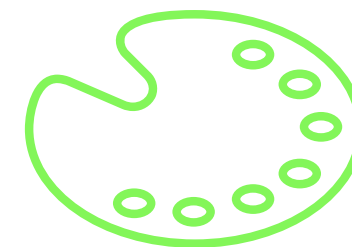
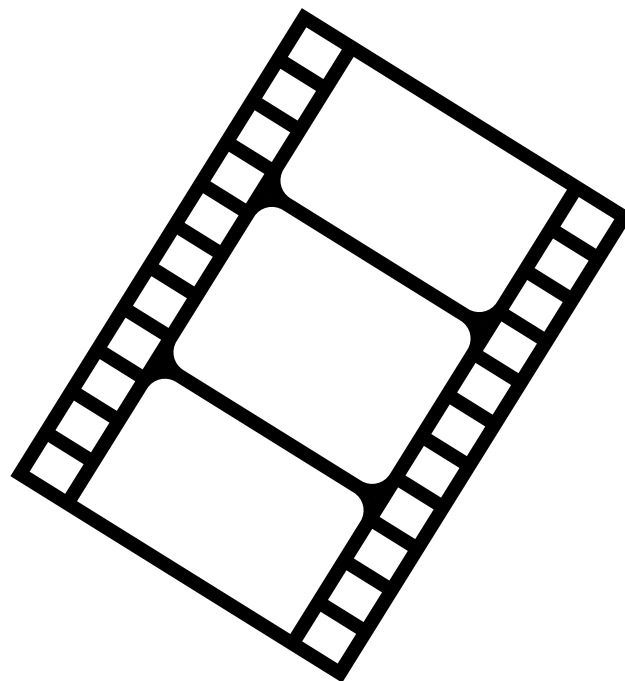
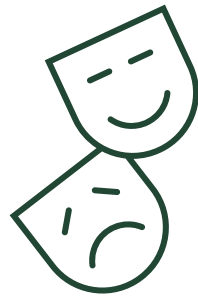
Research data and copyright



“Copyright protection shall extend to **expressions** and not to ideas, procedures, methods of operation or mathematical concepts as such.”

TRIPS art 9(2)

Database protection

For the purposes of this Directive, 'database' shall mean a collection of independent works, data or other materials arranged in a systematic or methodical way and individually accessible by electronic or other means.

Database directive art 1 (2.)

The database as an entity is protected, not the data
