There are also sub-tests where the aphasic person hears a verb and at the same time looks at more drawings. Then the person should point to the drawing that best fits the verb. It is not the meaning that the speech therapist should always use all the sub-tests in VOST, but rather choose out sub-tests he or she assumes will give better insight into the problems of a person with acquired aphasia
