

Name	MSEL (MULLEN SCALES OF EARLY LEARNING)
Purpose:	MSEL is a test for identifying of cognitive abilities in children aged 0-68 months
Short description:	The test consists of five scales that assess child's gross motor skills, visual perception, fine motor skills, receptive language and expressive language. In addition, a total score based on all the questions (The Early Learning Composite Score) is also calculated. It takes between 30 and 60 minutes to administer the test, depending on a child's age
