

Name	TEST OF WORD READING EFFICIENCY (TOWRE)
Purpose:	It is a quick test to assess fluency and accuracy of print-based word reading strategies. It uses phonemic decoding and sight word recognition. It can be useful to identify children who are falling behind in word reading skills
Short description:	TOWRE is a standardized test composed of subtests for increased word reading efficiency (reading real words) and phonemic decoding efficiency (reading pseudo-words)
